

Dear Campus Community,

As we continue to seek ways to provide our students a residential experience this fall, ensuring the health and safety of our students, faculty and staff remains our top priority.

Therefore, effective immediately, the UK COVID-19 Guidelines applicable to students state that students who test positive for COVID-19 through an off-campus test are required to communicate their results to UK Health Corps at healthcorps@uky.edu.

Community members also should note the following:

- This requirement applies irrespective of the type of test conducted, whether involving an antigen (rapid) test or a molecular (PCR) test.
- Notification of a positive result must also include official documentation. If students have tested positive off campus and have not yet received documentation, they are still required to notify Health Corps immediately at healthcorps@uky.edu.
- This requirement applies to students living both on and off campus, as long as they plan to be physically present on campus at any time throughout the semester.

The Code of Student Conduct was recently updated to include the following Standard of Conduct

— Failure to Follow UK COVID-19 Health and Safety Guidelines:

- A student or registered student organization (RSO) may face discipline under the Code of Student Conduct for failing to follow the health and safety guidelines related to COVID-19 announced by the University.
- These guidelines are based upon guidance from the CDC and input from UK's START team. As knowledge related to COVID-19 evolves, guidelines may change over time.
